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2011 Update

Well it's the new year, and the Cyclone Power Pullers hope everybody is ready for 2011 to run its course. Over the past months the Cyclone Power Pullers A-Team has been hard at work designing our newest tractor. With the new rules this year, the 2011 tractor will no doubt have a different appearance than the last few tractors. New rules have presented new opportunities for innovation, and plenty of challenges as well. Along with A-Team's endeavears, our X-team has been making progress in their renovations of the 2010 tractor "Cydewinder". With competition getting closer and closer, the design is nearly completed and parts are coming in our doors. In addition to our new design, the Cyclone Power Pullers have made appearances at the Des Moines Product Show at the end of October and the early December National Quarter Scale Championship in Kansas City . We hope to see anybody who is free at the National Competition at Peoria, Illinois's Expo Gardens this year from June 2nd—5th.

2011 Competition Rule Changes

For the 2011 Quarter Scale Tractor Competition, the rules have been greatly revamped. Since 2006 teams have been allowed to run an infinite number of engines (within what weight will allow of course) however, in 2011 teams will be limited to 1 or 2. They may either run 2 of the classic Briggs & Straton 16hp V-Twin Engines, or a new Briggs and Straton 31hp big block. In addition to the new engine requirements, different drive wheel limits have been imposed. Teams are still allowed to run a two wheel drive configuration, but the 4 wheel drive option has been replaced with a front wheel assist opportunity.

Along with these two main changes, a new hitch height requirement has been set at 13 inches. Weight classes have been changed from 1050 and 1550 lbs to 1000 and 1500 lbs to coincide with the updated weight requirement of 800 lbs.

These rule changes will certainly give competition a new look this year and hopefully will create room for some interesting new design concepts. The first year of the new rules will certainly prove to be a learning year, and we believe we have created a product that will be able to strongly compete for the 2011 title.

2011 A-Team & X Team Design Preview

The 2011 rule changes have given us a variety of configurations to choose from. Two critical decisions were to implement the 31hp Briggs Big Block engine rather than the two 16hp engines, and to use the front wheel assist configuration rather than two wheel drive. The 2011 tractor is designed around being a reliable, maintenance free tractor. User friendly features include easily accessible driveline components, comfortable operator station, a custom exhaust system, and innovative electronic controls. We hope that with the new ideas being implemented into the 2011 tractor, we can not only excel in the pulls, but also in specific design judging areas.

Over the past few months the 2011 X-Team has been hard at work redesigning "Cydewinder", the 2010 tractor. Simplification is the main goal of the team, while still maintaining the features that made "CydeWinder" stand out. The team is working to reduce the complexity of the electrical system to reduce the chances of issues arising. This will be done by moving from 4 ECU's to just two and by implementing a mechanical linkage throttle to replace the quad solenoid system. With the weight of the tractor (850lbs max) coming into play with any design changes, the X Team is also looking to lighten any components possible. It is going to be a challenging semester for the X team, with a lot of work ahead.
